

Rate Designation: Residential All Electric Service; Rate Code 02

Class of Service: 120/240 volt, single-phase alternating current, farm and non-farm residences.

Service Area: All areas.

Availability: Applicable for single-phase service through a single meter to all member-consumers of the Cooperative for electric heating who are receiving service at the same location for other usages, subject to the Cooperative's standard service as described in section four of this Tariff, all subject to the terms of the service contract and membership application approved by the Linn County REC Board of Directors. Service hereunder is subject to the provisions of the Cooperative Electric Service Standards.

Monthly Rate:

Facility Charge	\$10.50 per month
Energy Charge	
First 400 kWhs per month	\$0.1044 per kWh
Next 800 kWhs per month	\$0.0828 per kWh
Over 1,200 kWhs per month	\$0.0651 per kWh

Minimum Monthly Charge:

1. The minimum monthly charge, under the above rates, shall be the Facility Charge when 10 kVA or less of transformer capacity is required.
2. Whenever a transformer of greater capacity than 10 kVA is required to provide adequate service to a member-consumer, a monthly service charge of \$0.75 per kVA in excess of 10 kVA shall be added to the Facility Charge, for which service charge kWhs will be furnished.

Billing: The bill is the amount computed when applying the energy adjustment clause and the above rate to the number of kWhs consumed. Bills are rendered on or about the 3rd working day of each month and are due on or before the 25th of each month. Payments received in the office after the 25th of the month will be considered late.

A late payment charge calculated as 1.5% of the current unpaid balance will be added after the 25th of the month.

An additional day will be allowed for payments received at the office of the Cooperative if the 25th falls on a day when the office is not open to receive payments. Each service account shall be granted one, complete forgiveness of a late payment charge per calendar year.

Restrictions: The member-consumer shall provide the Cooperative a floor plan or blue print showing the direction the home faces and elevations. Insulation requirements, including basement, window, door, and fireplace openings shall be indicated. From this information the Cooperative will create a computerized heat loss-heat gain analysis and provide an estimated operating cost for the member-consumer.

The member-consumer shall be responsible for notifying the Cooperative when the heating installation is complete and the Cooperative will make an "on site" installation verification prior to activating this rate. The member-consumer shall be responsible for informing the Cooperative if they no longer have electric heating within 90 days of removal of such heating.

Energy Adjustment
Clause:

Tax:

The State of Iowa Sales Tax shall be added to the total bill as determined in the above listed provisions. In the event any governmental taxing body shall impose any tax or charge of any kind based on the amount of electricity sold under this schedule, or upon receipts from such sales, the Cooperative will add the amount of such tax or charge to the billing.
